

Josette Altmann Borbón, Magíster Scientiae in Political Sciences, Bachelor and Licenciada in History from the University of Costa Rica. From 1990 to 1991 she was an intern at Harvard University. She is professor of History and Political Science at the University of Costa Rica, and is member of the Evaluation Committee in Postgraduate Studies in Education, at the University of Costa Rica.

Professor Altmann has served as Consultant in training programs with emphasis on public policy making and proposals for social policy for the Democratic Centre of Latin America Studies (CEDAL). She also managed projects related to public policies in social areas with the International Labour Organization (ILO) from 2000 to 2003, and with the Costa Rican government from 1994 through 1998.

She is author or co-author of several books and numerous academic publications in English and Spanish on Latin American political history, politics, foreign affairs and regional integration.
